PUBLIC SESSION:

Moyor discussed recent shooting and introduction of Anti-Violence Committee. Asked for Councilwoman Scott to provide information: 25 mentors to have a presence and change the negativity and drama with the youth. Has a meeting with the Superintendent to discuss program with the Penns Grove Middle School. To date there have been 15 men that have volunteered. Mayor interjected that you do not have to be a dad but dad figure can volunteer.

Irene Scarpaci – questioned on the anti-violence grant and Mayor advised it is in process.

Greg Martin – Spruce Street – seeking update on Barber Avenue Park. Mr. Tarver advised they had a meeting regarding the park, renovations were needed due to insurance. Received bid from CTX – some things were unable to be completed due to cost. Court needs more work, weather was part of the delay and asphalt unavailable until mid-April. Once asphalt completed it will need to settle for 30 days.

Also seeks clarity on Sewer Authority and when he moves from the Borough to a neighboring town if he is able to stay on the committee. Mr. Tarver advised there is no residency requirement. Mayor advised he will inform Council and they will advise Mr. Martin but he was unable to answer at the meeting. Mr. Martin also made a statement to Council President, Mrs. Martin, thanking her for her position and the integrity and care she has for the community.

Carl Washington – Pitman St – States unless the motion has been changed there is no residency requirement to be on Sewer Authority. He states he has been on the Sewer Authority for 15 years and the behaviors are causing resignations of employees and committee members. Members are being spoken to with expletives and in a condescending fashion. Mayor advised they will look it to this. Councilwoman Scott apologized that no one should be treated in that manner especially when volunteering their time. Director Rivera added if the Police presence is needed he will be sure that happens for the meetings.

Carol Mincey –Questioned the cost coverage for changes at the park. Stated she had requested the contract and did not receive. She wanted to know the terms f the agreement and who is handling terms outside the scope of the agreement. Mr. Tarver advised they will have a better picture once the excavation occurs and how it will be handled.

Stphen Labb- Comments he was late in being added to the agenda and wanted to provide an update. There is a 10,000 increase for recreation. Pension, benefits and fuel costs. 550,000 transitional aid – 126 year. 5.3 cent tax increase vs 6.4 last year. Building Surplus is due March 31, meeting requested for March 28, 2023. Mayor – Special meeting just for Budget Ordinances.
